2019 ANNUAL REPORT

Pacific Northwest Search and Rescue (PNWSAR) is an all-volunteer non-profit organization dedicated to providing search and rescue assistance for people who are lost or injured out of doors. We provide ground search teams and other specialized SAR resources to the official agencies responsible for search and rescue activities in our region. We are on call 24 hours a day and 365 days a year to respond quickly when called upon at any time, day or night. We train above and beyond the state SAR certification standard, and are equipped and skilled at operating in challenging weather and terrain typical of our regional wilderness areas.










# Search and Rescue Training Hours

## **2020 GOALS**

- Increase proactive patrols to educate hikers, potentially reducing lost or injured individuals
- Purchase a remote satellite communications system with awarded grant money
- Increase leadership training and resilience training
- Join with PNWSAR's sister SAR teams to conduct joint trainings, making multi-agency mission responses more efficient
