On October, 1 2018, at 1744 hrs, SAR Coordinator Cori Oakes was notified that Grand Canyon Regional Communications Center had received a report from a visitor that they found a dead body below the second Trailview Overlook on a social trail that goes west from the Bright Angel Trail at Cinch Up. The reporting party stated that they saw a [REDACTED] body lying across the trail, and did not approach.

At 1932 hours, Ranger Brian Densmore and Paramedic Josh Weiner responded to the area via foot. They were able to confirm that the subject was deceased due to obvious decomposition. At the scene they located the reported body in close proximity to the social trail. While investigating the area, they located a second body, 100 - 200' south/above the first body. Both bodies appeared to be in the same state of decomposition, and had trauma associated with a fall from the rim. Due to darkness and steep terrain, responders left the area with plans to return the following morning. This was done in consultation with the Coconino County Medical Examiner's Office.

On October 02, 2018 at 0900 hours a team of investigators and SAR technicians traveled to the area on foot. ISB Special Agents Oakes, Hardin, and Confer and Rangers Barton and Baird completed a crime scene investigation, and packaged the bodies in body bags and a helicopter net. After concluding the investigation at 1600 hours, rain, fog, and low clouds prevented the flying of aircraft for extraction. Rescuers hiked out, and the bodies remained at the location over night and a plan was made to return in the morning during better weather conditions. Incident Command was transferred from L. Hodgson to R. McDonald-O'Lear.

On October 03, 2018 at 1000 hrs, a briefing was conducted at South Rim Helibase. Helicopter Crewmember J. Sarabia hiked into the site to hook the sling load. Helicopter 8PA extracted the bodies via longline and transported them to the South Rim Helibase. At 1100 hours, the bodies were transported to Station 1, and left in the custody of SA Oakes. The bodies were picked up by the Coconino County Medical Examiner's Office.

At 1200 hours, Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) operators Eric Graff, and Brian Hakansan responded to Second Trailview. They conducted a UAS search of the fall line above the recovery site.

All times are approximate.

On October 01, 2018 around 1800 hrs. Grand Canyon Regional Dispatch received a report from a visitor that they found a dead body below Trailview 2 overlook on a social trail that goes west from the Bright Angel Trail at Cinch Up. While investigating the area, they located a second body, 100 - 200' south/above the first body. Both bodies appeared to be in the same state of decomposition, and had gross trauma associated with a fall from the rim. Due to darkness and steep terrain, responders left the area with plans to return the following morning. This was done in consultation with the Coconino County Medical Examiner's Office.

On October 02, 2018 a team of investigators and SAR technicians traveled to the area on foot. Crime scene investigation was completed, and the bodies were packaged for extraction via long line. Due to rain, fog, and low clouds, extraction was postponed. Rescuers hiked out, and the bodies remained at the location over night.

On October 03, 2018 SAR Technician J. Sarabia, E. Graff and M. Walls hiked into the site to facilitate extraction of the bodies. Helicopter 8PA extracted the bodies via longline and transported them to the SRHB. The bodies were transferred to Station 1, then turned over to the medical examiner's office.

### SUMMARY:

This report documents the recovery of two bodies below Trail View 2 overlook and the use of a drone to document the fall line.

### DETAILS:

On October 2, 2018, I, Special Agent (SA) Philip Oakes, SA Mike Hardin, SA Abigail Confer, United States Park Ranger (USPR) Shane Barton, USPR Joelle Baird, and National Park Service volunteer James Sarabia recovered two bodies below the Trail View 2 overlook on the South Rim of Grand Canyon National Park.

SA Hardin and SA Confer sketched and measured all evidence on scene. SA Oakes and USPR Barton took photos and collected evidence. All parties present participated in packaging the bodies in body bags. Sarabia was in charge of securing the bodies in a net for helicopter extraction.

The bodies were extracted on October 3, 2018. A request was made that the Grand Canyon Heli-base use their drone to document the fall line. They came out the same day and videoed the fall line.

### SUMMARY:

This report documents my investigative actions on the scene of a double fatality below the Trail View Two overlook on West Rim Drive, Grand Canyon National Park.

### DETAILS:

On the morning of October 2, 2018, I responded, as part of a body recovery/scene investigation team, to the vicinity of Lat/Long position N 36.06590 W 112.14555. This location is within the Grand Canyon, below the Trail View Two Overlook.

*Investigator's Note: Geologic formations in the area interfere with satellite signals, causing accuracy issues. All GPS (Global Positioning System) data associated with this scene should be treated as approximate.*

The scene itself faces southeast and is comprised of steeply-sloped loose soil and rock talus. Vegetation on the scene consists of clustered juniper trees separated by large amounts of open space. The top end of the scene abuts the bottom of an 83 foot, essentially sheer, cliff with the Trail View Two Overlook directly above (see attached Google Earth images). The weather at the scene was overcast and foggy with constant rainfall. Temperatures were in the upper 50's farenheight.

My assignment was to sketch the scene (attached) and document positioning of the deceased and all debris items located. I obtained all relevant positions using a Garmin Oregon 745t GPS unit (see attached handwritten table of GPS data). In addition to GPS location, Special Agent (SA) Abigail Confer and I designated two reference points (large, live trees), marked with police crime scene tape on the trunk, and utilized compass and measuring tape to determine positions for each of the deceased and each item located (see attached Table of Measurements). Each item number correlates to the number assigned by the photography team and is represented by yellow number placards as photographed.

Once teh scene was documented, I assisted with packaging of the deceased and preparations for helicopter recovery.

Using Google Earth to plot GPS data from the scene revealed significant positioning errors, including the positions of the reference points. On, October 3, 2018 SA Philip Oakes, Park Ranger (PR) Shane Barton and I went to the Trail View Two Overlook to assess the scene. We located the spot on the edge of the canyon rim directly above the scene at Lat/Long N 36.06609 W 112.14577. From that location I could identify both of the reference points. Using a compass, I shot azimuths to each reference point to fix their positions. I then hand-plotted all



the compass-derived data in Google Earth to produce the attached satellite scene image.

**Report:**

On October 2, 2018, at approximately 1800 hrs I heard radio traffic about a deceased individual below the rim of Grand Canyon and visible from Kolb Studio. I asked the incident commander, Officer Paul Riese, how I could help. I was assigned, along with NPS Paramedic Josh Weiner to complete scene documentation, package decedent(1) into a body bag, and secure the bag to the slope for extraction at a later time. These decisions were based up the safety concerns of attempting a night recovery, along with impending heavy rains expected the following day.

I was told by Officer Riese decedent(1) was located in the middle of the "Cinch Up Trail" and approximately between the areas below Trailview 1 Overlook and Maricopa Pt. The "Cinch Up Trail" is a small side trail, previously with an unknown name, leaving the Bright Angel Trail approximately ½ mile below the rim at a switchback named Cinch Up.

Paramedic Weiner and I located decedent(1) immediately below the Trailview 2 Overlook and in the center of the "Cinch Up Trail." Decedent(1) was in a roughly prone position with the head pointed north. The right arm was pointed down hill (east). The decedent(1) showed signs of moderate to heavy decomposition, with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)

I saw brunette hair, small feet, and skin tight leggings, indicating decedent(1) was female.

I began to search the area uphill of decedent(1), primarily to scout extraction methods for the following day, but also for potential clues as to how big the investigative scene would be. About 50 feet above and only a few feet to the north of the plumb line to decedent(1), I saw decedent(2).

Decedent(2) appeared (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) base of a tree. One of decedent(2)'s (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) Decedent(2) had black hair, gym short style pants, indicating male. Decedent(2)'s (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), indicating a similar level of decomposition to decedent (1).

I notified Officer Riese, who was standing with Special Agent Phil Oakes, of the second decedent. We discussed the investigative ramifications of the second decedent, arriving at one of four possibilities: (1) a slip and fall, with one party dragging the other off, (2) double suicide, (3) murder suicide, and (4) coincidence. Given the Initial assignment, Paramedic Weiner and I did not have enough equipment to bag both decedents, nor enough equipment to appropriately document a potential homicide scene. We discussed the probability of a murder suicide was significant enough to warrant ceasing planned operations.

Based on available equipment and the still impending weather, I was reassigned to secure decedent(1) to the slope as best as I could, while minimally disturbing the scene. Neither Paramedic Weiner nor I had equipment to secure decedent(2), but the location in the tree was determined to be sufficient to prevent movement with the impending rain.

I secured decedent(1) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)

Additionally, while scouting above decedent(1), I found two uppers of a leather strapped shoe and one matching lower, a whole loafer style (and traditionally male) shoe, and a single earpiece of a pair of glasses.

With the exception above of better securing decedent(1), everything was left in place and Paramedic Weiner and I returned to the Bight Angel Trailhead, arriving at about 2200 hrs.

On 10/1/18 at approx 1730 hrs Grand Cyn N.P. dispatch was notified that two hikers had found a dead body on an undesignated trail that leaves from the "Cinchoop" corner of Bright Angel trail.

Two park staff went to the scene and found the body. Upon searching the area the staff found a second body at the base of the tree approx 50 ft above the original body.

Both had injuries consistent with a fall from the rim. Both bodies were found in the same fall line. Shoes and glasses were found above the bodies in a similar fall line.

No I.D. was found on either body. No suicide note was found with either body.

### DETAILS:

Between the dates of December 10, 2018 and February 20, 2019, I, Special Agent Kyler Carpenter, performed data extractions and created disk images for evidence items SB-007, SB-008, and SB-009.

#### SB-007

SB-007 is an iPhone 7 with MSISDN (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and IMEI (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). After obtaining the passcode to unlock the device, I performed two data extractions. On December 10, 2018, I performed a data extraction using (b) (7)(E) and a data extraction using (b) (7)(E). I noted that the owner name was recorded as "Jessica's iPhone" and the Apple ID was recorded as jessicatbartz@gmail.com (mailto:jessicatbartz@gmail.com). Extraction reports are attached.

#### SB-008

SB-008 is an iPhone 7 with MSISDN (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and IMEI (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). Email address garretbonkowski@yahoo.com (mailto:garretbonkowski@yahoo.com) is associated with this device. Efforts to obtain the passcode for this device were unsuccessful so no data extraction was performed.

#### SB-009

SB-009 is an Apple MacBook Pro laptop computer with serial number C02TT58PHTD5. The device has a user enabled password protected log on. Efforts to obtain the password were not successful. I changed the boot sequence of the device and launched (b) (7)(E). I was able to create a physical and logical disk image and image the recovery and EFI modules. The image files were entered into evidence as item KC-01 and will be maintained in case forensic capabilities are developed that may be used to decode the data.

Identification of Vehicle and Inventory

At approximately 1100 hours, on 10/03/2018, the Coconino County Medical Examiner's office took custody of both bodies. Upon initial examination of the male subject, the Medical Examiner's Forensic Investigator, and I, US Park Ranger Shane Barton, located a set of Mazda vehicle keys, in his front shorts pocket.

At approximately 1220 hours, on 10/03/2018, a gray Mazda 3 ( [REDACTED] ) was located in Parking Lot C at Grand Canyon National Park. The Mazda came back registered to Jessica and [REDACTED] Bartz of Mesa, AZ. The park entrance receipt taped to the windshield, showed entrance into Grand Canyon National Park on 09/18/2018 at approximately 1445 hours. The key found on the male subject unlocked the vehicle, confirming it was associated with the two (2) bodies.

I observed in plain view, a purse and wallet in the front driver side floor board of the vehicle. For identification purposes and to ensure safe keeping, I removed the purse and wallet from the vehicle. Inside the purse was one (1) female's wallet, one (1) male's wallet and a cell phone. The cell phone was placed back in the vehicles center console and the vehicle was locked.

[REDACTED] thinks Garret pushed Jessica, and then he jumped.

Garret was a very controlling boyfriend.

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) flew to Phoenix to visit Jessica. Shortly after arriving Garret called, said he had a family emergency and Jessica ended up spending the night with Garret.

They visited the Grand Canyon on their trip and hiked along the area close to the site Jessica and Garret fell from.

Jessica was not a risk taker. Jessica enjoyed hiking and the outdoors, but would not rock climb or "jump across a four (4) foot gap in the trail".

Garret stated he had a job multiple times. [REDACTED] doesn't believe that to be true.

[REDACTED] bought a plane ticket for Jessica to (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) in May 2018. Jessica informed [REDACTED] a few weeks before (b) (6), (b) (7) she was not coming (b) (6) because, Garret got a job Florida and they were moving there.

In April 2018, Jessica stopped communication with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). Jessica stated "I don't wanna have a relationship with you". Jessica never gave a good explanation other than [REDACTED] contacted her too much.

Jessica continued to communicate with [REDACTED] via text and phone calls, two (2) to three (3) times a week. Around July 4, 2018, [REDACTED] sent Jessica a text and did not hear back. [REDACTED] continued attempting to contact Jessica and did not hear

back.

On July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2018 [REDACTED] contacted Peoria police to do a welfare check on Jessica. Peoria police went to (b) (6), (b) (6), (b) (6) but no one was home. Jessica cashed in her retirement account with Dillard's.

[REDACTED] was on Jessica's bank account and she had a decent size balance in her account. However, Jessica and Garret went through \$1300 in one month. This was uncharacteristic of Jessica.

Jessica was pretty frugal, only really spending money on food and she had gone vegan. Jessica would shop at Sprout and usually would not eat out much.

Started eating out every day at places like Chipotle, Circle K convenience store, and McDonald's which she rarely ate at before.

Jessica took a trip to Los Angeles on July 22, 2018.

Jessica liquidated her bank account around July, 22, 2018 (balance at that time approximately \$200).

Jessica contacted [REDACTED] around August 2, 2018 and stated she wanted a one-way ticket [REDACTED] that day.

[REDACTED] felt Jessica was acting normal while she was [REDACTED]

(b) [REDACTED] asked Jessica, "Why haven't you contacted me?" Jessica stated [REDACTED] had been contacting her too much.

Jessica confronted (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) [REDACTED] Jessica stated, Garret has a good car with a couple hundred thousand miles [REDACTED] thought the conversation was odd and unusual for Jessica.

(b) On the night of August 6, 2018, Jessica stated, she wanted to go back to Arizona because Garret had a job in Florida.

(b) [REDACTED] asked Jessica, what her goals were. Jessica stated, she just wanted to enjoy life's experiences and Garret would support her.

Jessica worked two jobs when she first moved to Arizona and got her realtors license in the winter of 2017.

Jessica decided, she didn't want to do real estate anymore [REDACTED] believes the owners of the real estate company may have knowledge about what Jessica was into before she quite the real estate company.

Jessica's plan was to move to Arizona, get her associates degree, then move to Portland.

Jessica was a free spirit.

It seemed like Jessica lost her initiative once she met Garret.

On October 16, 2018, at 1300 hours, I, Special Agent (SA) Philip Oakes along with United States Park Ranger (USPR) Shane Barton and Grand Canyon National Park (GRCA) Search and Rescue volunteer James Sarabia interviewed (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). The interview was recorded and all parties present were aware of the recording.

(b) (6), (b) (7) provided the following information:

*Investigators Note: This report is a summation of the salient points of the this interview and not intended to include all facts. A DVD with the complete audio recording along with a transcription are attached to this report.*

Until September 17, 2018, Jessica and Garret were living with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) in Peoria, AZ. They were kicked out (b) (6), (b) (7) house.

On October 5, 2018, (b) (6), (b) (7) was notified Jessica died. On October 7, 2018, (b) (6), (b) (7) talked with (b) (6), (b) (7) and was notified the investigation was closed.

Jessica's relationship with Garret was emotional and verbally abusive. They were in a constant cycle of breaking up and getting back together. In the last six months Jessica went from a successful woman who had a job, an apartment, and friends to losing all of it. She had jobs from the age of sixteen . At times she had two or three jobs. It was a sudden "180 degree" change in her life.

Garret and Jessica spent most of their time in their room at (b) (6), (b) (7) house.

During a dinner with Garret, he told [REDACTED] he believed jobs were "overrated." He was late to dinner and was acting weird by "bouncing around" for the first twenty minutes.

Garret had his "claws in" Jessica.

On September 17, 2018, Jessica called (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and said she wanted to [REDACTED]. She wanted to improve her life. Garret was not going to be allowed (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) were working on getting Jessica \$500 to help her get [REDACTED]. That money was never sent to Jessica.

There was an on-going lie about Garret having a job lined up in Florida.

On September 17, 2018, when (b) (6), (b) (7) kicked Jessica and Garret out of [REDACTED] house [REDACTED] gave them \$300 and made them sign a form. [REDACTED] videoed them signing the form. (b)

(b) (7) wonders if Garret pushed Jessica off the rim of the Grand Canyon.

Garret was controlling. An example was when he may not have let Jessica go to her (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)

Jessica cut off communication from [REDACTED] in April 2018. (b) (7)

The Peoria, AZ police department had to do a welfare check on Garret and Jessica (date unknown).

[REDACTED] believes it is strange Jessica and Garret left their phone in the car while they were at the Grand Canyon. Jessica's phone service was stopped because she didn't pay the bill.

On August 2, 2018, Jessica called [REDACTED] about wanting a one-way plane ticket [REDACTED] Jessica [REDACTED] and appeared thin and pale to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] took her out clothes shopping. During her visit home she "didn't act right." She was confrontational and didn't know how long she would stay [REDACTED] Jessica had no marks of physical abuse during the visit. (b) (7)

(b) (7) believes Garret is an emotional abuser. Jessica doesn't have a strong personality and is more of a "follower." Garret believes in conspiracy theories and Jessica was prone to follow along with his beliefs. Garret believed that planes, operated by the government, were emitting poisonous gas for population control. Jessica believed this theory and stopped hiking.

Jessica was an avid hiker who had hiking boots and a hydration pack.

Jessica had Celiac's Disease so she only ate Vegan/Organic. She was on a very strict diet. During the month of June or July her bank account went from \$1800 to a negative balance. There were expenditures for fast food. Due to her Celiac's Disease she could not eat fast food because it would make her sick. Jessica also had about \$3000 in an account at Edward Jones which was depleted.

Jessica had no history of depression know to [REDACTED]

Garret was very adventurous and enjoyed off-trail hiking. He had "unique views" of the world. He was into computer programming.

Jessica was enamored by Garret.

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) does not believe the fall to be pre-meditated. (b) (6) believes that Jessica slipped and pulled Garret down with her. She has no proof to support this scenario.

The day before Garret and Jessica moved out of (b) (6) Garret broke up with Jessica.

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) told them both to leave (b) (6). (b) (6) gave them one month of notice. (b) (6) paid them \$300 to (b) (6) the night of September 17, 2018. When they moved out (b) (6) had them sign an agreement. (b) (6) videoed Garret signing the agreement. (b) (6) did this because (b) (6) was afraid of the law that protects tenants. Jessica and Garret lived with (b) (6) for three and a half months. (b) (6) asked them to leave because they were not helping clean or offering to pay for anything. Garret did not pack any possessions

when he moved out.

On September 17, 2018, there was an incident where [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) had to call the police because of the way that Garret was acting. Garret threatened [REDACTED] by eluding that he may have put drugs in [REDACTED] bedroom. When the police came Garret and Jessica left.

Garret told [REDACTED] that he and Jessica were going to move in with [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) were supposed to send her money to help with the move. The story changed a number of times regarding who exactly was moving [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] does believe it could have been a double suicide but it would be hard to believe.

Garret was on the prescription drug Adderall.

Garret and Jessica had a fight on September 17, 2018, because Garret had broken up with her. Garret is not a violent person. He does have the ability to be threatening and intimidating. He did not treat Jessica well.

[REDACTED] had a "bad feeling" when Garret and Jessica moved out [REDACTED]. [REDACTED], also had a feeling [REDACTED] was never going to see [REDACTED] again.

During the last month they lived with [REDACTED] Garret looked thinner and less hygienic. Jessica took care of herself and looked normal.

Garret believed in government conspiracies, aliens, and ideas behind the real purpose of the pyramids.

At one point in their relationship Jessica left Garret and he "fell apart."

Garret started using heroin in the fall of 2017. Jessica did not use heroin but she did use marijuana and alcohol.

Garret used to have a job at [REDACTED] to help pay off his student loans.

It was common for Jessica to make organic juice. When she would make juice she was good about cleaning up after herself. She bought food for [REDACTED] Overall she was a very sweet and positive person.

Garret spoke often about having a job in Florida [REDACTED] was not sure that the job was real or even existed.

On August 18, 2018, [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) texted [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to see if [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) could talk to Jessica. Officers Snyder and Heller attempted to look over the edge of the canyon and locate anyone that may have fallen or jumped with the help of the volunteer. There was nothing visible and there was no obvious sign at the edge of the canyon of anyone going over the edge.

A room key card for Yavapai Lodge was found near the bag. I contacted the front desk staff at Yavapai Lodge and found it belonged to [REDACTED] who had checked out at 0808 hours that morning from room [REDACTED]. We found a reservation sheet for Grand Canyon Tour Company with the name [REDACTED] on it and a pickup location of Bright Angel Lodge for later that day. At 1535 Officer Shoemaker contacted [REDACTED] before Grand Canyon Tour Company picked him up to leave. [REDACTED] reported he was in good health and had no missing property. The card at this time was deemed not associated with the found property.

On October 23, 2018, I, Special Agent Philip Oakes, contacted Dr. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) M.D., who was treating Garret Bonkowski prior to his death. Bonkowski was being treated for a mood disorder due to known physiological condition (unspecified) and attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder. Dr. [REDACTED] had prescribed Adderall to Bonkowski.

Dr. [REDACTED] had last seen Bonkowski on July 2, 2018. Bonkowski had been a patient of Dr. [REDACTED] since 2003.

Bonkowski had a history of depression (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). Dr. [REDACTED] had never known Bonkowski to be suicidal. He was unaware that Bonkowski was a drug user. He was aware that Bonkowski was denied acceptance into the military due to a criminal history with a drug offense.

There was nothing unusual or of concern regarding Bonkowski. Bonkowski was living with his girlfriend and "getting happier."

Dr. [REDACTED] agreed to, with permission of (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), release approximately the last year of notes he had of Bonkowski.

[REDACTED] provided the following information:

*Investigators Note: This report is a summation of the salient points of this interview and not intended to contain all facts. A DVD with the complete audio recording of this interview is attached to the report.*

Jessica "fell off the grid." During the month of June and after [REDACTED] tried to contact Jessica and there was no response.

Jessica went to [REDACTED] real estate school and graduated in October of 2017. It took Jessica a couple of times to pass her Arizona real estate licensing test which is abnormal. Jessica was the youngest realtor (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) [REDACTED] Jessica was semi-active due to her full-time job at Dillard's.

Jessica had "the best attitude" and became an extension of [REDACTED]'s family. She was so close to the family [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) [REDACTED] would joke about being replaced in the family by Jessica.

In April or May of 2018, Jessica told [REDACTED] she would be moving with her boyfriend, Garret, to Florida. Garret had a job offer but it's start date kept getting pushed back.

[REDACTED] took Jessica and Garret out to dinner at [REDACTED] before they were supposed to move to Florida. [REDACTED] believes Garret was supposed to have a job with computers in Florida. [REDACTED] found it strange that he would be recruited across country for computer work since he was so young and inexperienced.

Garret was "quirky" and had a "different sense of humor." He had a "hippy style" to him and appeared to be very intelligent.

Garret and Jessica adored one another but they didn't seem like they were a good fit for each other.

Jessica had an apartment on (b) (6), (b) (7) AZ. Jessica worked out of the [REDACTED] office that was ran by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] knew that Garret was a marijuana smoker. [REDACTED] doesn't believe Jessica smoked marijuana.

Jessica appeared to pay for everything in the relationship.

[REDACTED] thought it was strange they would be moving to [REDACTED] since Jessica's [REDACTED] (b) didn't know she was living with Garret when [REDACTED] came out to visit in the spring of 2018.

[REDACTED] never saw any type of marks or bruises on Jessica. Jessica was always smiling and never complained about Garret. Jessica would light up a room with her personality.

### DETAILS:

On October 25, 2018, I, Special Agent (SA) Philip Oakes, interviewed (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) via telephone. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) had called the Investigative Services Branch Tip Line regarding Jessica Bartz and Garret Bonkowski. The interview was not recorded.

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) provided the following information:

Jessica "vanished from the face of the earth." It has been four to five months since (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) has heard from her. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) is Jessica's friend in Arizona and has known her for four years.

Jessica and Garret both used Mushrooms, Acid, Marijuana, Ecstasy, Molly (MDMA) and possibly Methamphetamine. Garret was a Heroin user as well. Garret was a heavy drug user and introduced Jessica to hard drugs. Jessica only used Marijuana before knowing Garret.

Jessica was scared of Garret. Garret was known to throw things, pusher her, and punch walls. Within the last year their relationship became violent.

Garret and Jessica moved into an apartment together in Peoria, AZ. After they moved in together the violence started. Garret brought "turmoil" to Jessica's life.

Jessica was "wise beyond her years." She had to take care of Garret. The two were in a co-dependent relationship.

Jessica really enjoyed her new job in real estate. She also enjoyed her job at Dillard's. Jessica was sweet and responsible.

The last time [REDACTED] saw Jessica was in March when they were supposed to hang out together and watch a movie. Garret called Jessica and asked her to pick him and a friend up in Sedona (b) (6). [REDACTED] told Jessica not to go since it was so late in the evening. After having to pick up Garret in Sedona, Jessica seemed to change and she was willing to drop everything she was doing in her life, including her job, future career as a realtor, and apartment, to pursue WordPress like Garret. It was not like Jessica to drop everything for WordPress and stop communicating with her. Garret was interested in WordPress and computer programming.

*Investigator's Note: WordPress Is a website for building websites, apps, and other on-line media.*

Jessica's behavior was atypical over the past few months (b) (6). [REDACTED] interacted with her.

From what [REDACTED] knew, Garret sat at home all day and used drugs. Garret was a bad influence in Jessica's life. Jessica would pay for everything in their relationship.

Garret had suicidal tendencies and had "bouts with suicide." Jessica never talked about suicide.

The last communication [REDACTED] had with Jessica was via text in March of 2018. Jessica stopped communicating with [REDACTED] after those text messages. (6)

[REDACTED] believes Garret pushed Jessica off the rim of the canyon but [REDACTED] has not proof to support this belief. [REDACTED] does believe it is possible they were both on drugs and fell but [REDACTED] feels this scenario is unlikely.

Things in Jessica's life were "going to shit," [REDACTED] felt like Garret treated her "like shit."

Garret "couldn't survive without her (Jessica)" because she did everything for him.

Garret was a drug dealer. He sold Ecstasy in Phoenix. He would sell drugs at raves in the desert.

On one occasion Jessica told [REDACTED] that she had "tripped on Acid" and that caused her to see "shadow people."

### SUMMARY:

This report documents the closure of this case.

### DETAILS:

On November 15, 2018, United States Park Ranger Shane Barton and I, Special Agent Philip Oakes, presented the case to the Coconino County Medical Examiner. The medical examiner stated that without direct witnesses or evidence he could not rule on a manner of death.

On January 17, 2019, I spoke with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) Garret Bonkowski, and requested cell phone and laptop be returned to stated they had value to financially and practically.

On January 27, 2019, I spoke with Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) Pat Schneider regarding a search warrant for the phone and laptop. AUSA Schneider stated that the Department of Justice did not support the effort of getting a search warrant. The case lacked probable cause and without a direct witness to the event causing the deaths of the two it would still be inconclusive to the manner of death.

On January 29, 2019, I requested Computer Forensic Special Agent Kyler Carpenter return the two devices to (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) On February 22, 2019, he shipped them via FedEx and they arrived on February 25, 2019 (see attachments).

On January 29, 2019, I returned Jessica's phone to via FedEx.

On February 6, 2019, I updated and that the case would be closed due to lack of evidentiary leads.

The government is no longer in possession of any property or evidence related to this case.

All investigative leads have been exhausted.
